MACHINE PAPER PIECING TRICKS OF THE TRADE FULL-DAY WORKSHOP WITH CAROL DOAK



This exciting and fun technique of sewing oversize fabric pieces to a paper foundation drawing permits you to make accurate patchwork blocks easily and quickly without making any templates! Using your scraps, this full-day class will introduce you to some of the latest paper-piecing tricks of the trade as you sew several different small patchwork blocks featured in Carol's book, Easy Machine Paper Piecing published by That Patchwork Place to discover how to push the paper piecing limits!

Supplies:

Rotary cutter and mat and 6" square rotary ruler and 6" x 12" rotary ruler Small pair of fabric scissors

Translucent tracing paper - 2 squares each 5" x 5" Pencil.

Sewing machine with a 90/14 size needle, thread, straight pins without a large head or with flat heads and seam ripper

6" Add-A-Quarter Ruler and 6" Add-An-Eighth Ruler – I will have a supply of these available for purchase.

Fabric:

Bring a selection of your scraps (3/4 yard total would be plenty) in light, medium and dark values to use in creating your sample 4" paper-pieced flowers, tree and heart blocks. If you would like to use the same fabric for background for all the blocks, a larger piece of fabric is needed.
