
INTRODUCTION TO PAPER PIECING HALF-DAY WORKSHOP WITH CAROL DOAK



This exciting and fun technique of sewing oversize fabric pieces to a paper foundation drawing permits you to make accurate patchwork blocks easily and quickly without making any templates! Using your scraps, you will learn many tricks of the trade as you sew several different small patchwork blocks shown in Carol's book, <u>Easy Machine Paper Piecing</u>, published by That Patchwork Place.

Supplies:

Rotary cutter and mat and 6" square rotary ruler and 6" x 12" rotary ruler Small pair of fabric scissors

Translucent tracing paper - 4 squares each, 5" x 5"

Pencil

Sewing machine with a 90/14 size needle, thread, straight pins without a large head or flat headed pins and seam ripper

6" Add-A-Quarter Ruler

Fabric:

Bring a selection of your scraps (1/2 yard total would be plenty) in light, medium and dark values to use in creating your sample 4" paper-pieced blocks. You will be making a flower, a tree and a geometric block. You may one to bring more of one fabric to use as the background for all three blocks.
