


Cutting List for One Block:

No. to CutSize to CutLocation Numbers1 $1 3/4" \times 2 1/4"$ 1 - Great opportunity to fussy cut these2 $1 1/2" \times 1 1/4"$ 2, 32 $1 1/4" \times 2 1/2"$ 4, 52 $1 1/4" \times 2"$ 6, 71 $2 1/4" \times 2 1/4" [/]$ 8, 9*

Print 2 copies of this page Block finishes 2" and 2 1/2" with seam allowance.


1 $2 \frac{1}{4} \times 2 \frac{1}{4} [/] = 8, 9^*$ *[/] indicates to cut a square and cut it half diagonally. If you want to different colors here, you will need to cut two different squares.




Finished size 12" x 12"


Quilt One

Note about these quilt layouts: My goal was to provide several different layouts using the same block design and border. The colored versions are just a way to suggest one coloring for this layout. There are many others. The uncolored version is so you can play with the possibilities. I didn't indicate fabrics in the cutting list because it will vary. Decide on your color placement, determine how many blocks use the same color layout and multiply the pieces needed for one block times the number of blocks you are making to determine the number of pieces to cut for those blocks. Have fun!




Quilt One








