Not Your Grandmother's Feathered Star Simply Sensational 9-Patch Stars By Carol Doak

Description: Have you always admired those perfect Feathered Star blocks and thought you could never make one? With the ease and perfection of paper piecing, you too can achieve a stunning block that could be the showcase of your next quilt or the attention getting accent in a room such as a pillow on the sofa. Come and see just how easy it is to look like an expert and make a Feathered Star that is out of the box.

Supplies:

Sewing machine, size 90/14 needle, open toe presser foot, thread to match fabric, rotary cutter, 6" x 6" and 6" x 12" rotary rulers, 6" Add-A-Quarter ruler, rotary mat, flat-headed pins, scissors or snips. I will be supplying your foundations. I will reference my book, *Simply Sensational 9-Patch Stars*.



Yardage: You do not need to use these colors and may choose your own colors. Choose your center square focal print first, and draw your other colors from that fabric. **Bring extra fabric just in case you make a mistake.**

Focal print for center square: 41/2" x 41/2" Lt. Green for inside triangles: 51/2" x 51/2" Yellow for background: 1/4 yard Pink for feathers: 1/4 yard

Except for the Corner and Center squares, you can cut the other pieces bigger. Cut the following pieces and label them with **the location number using a stick –on note**. Trust me, do this while you are cutting and save yourself the trouble of doing it in class.

[X] Indicates to cut the squares and cut them twice diagonally to make quarter-square triangles.

[/] Indicates to cut the squares and them once diagonally to make half-square triangles.
